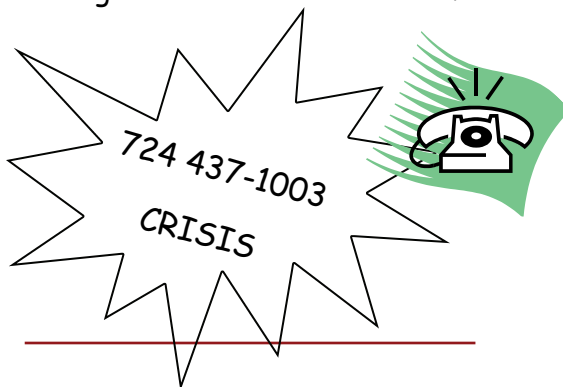

NON-DISCRIMINATION STATEMENT

What is family-based (HOPE Network) services?

Family Based is a voluntary service. It is a team delivered service that is child centered, family focused, and family driven. The treatment team offers comprehensive and intensive services to empower the family to care for their "at risk" child/adolescent. The goal is to reduce risk of out of home placement and includes strengthening the family, improving coping skills, and an advocate for the family.

What makes family-based (HOPE Network) different?

Family Based service is available to consumers 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. All clinical staff attend ongoing trainings, to complete a three year curriculum for family therapist certification. H.O.P.E Network therapists also attend specialized trainings to meet specific needs of family based consumers in the Fayette County area.



How is family-based (HOPE Network) services provided?

It is a voluntary service provided by a team approach with two mental health professions. Duration is 16-32 weeks and requires authorization from the family's behavioral health provider (health insurance). It requires community or in-home sessions 2-3 times/week at 1-3 hours per session. Services are scheduled with the family and flexible.

Who is eligible?

Children/adolescents who meet "medical necessity" criteria: Under the age of 21, exhibits serious emotional & behavior disturbances; is determined to be "high risk" for out-of-home placement; is involved with multiple systems and is determined by a psychiatrist, physician or licensed psychologist to need services.

What is the cost?

To receive services requires authorization form your behavioral health care plan (health insurance), or Fayette County MH/MR Office. For those not covered under insurance, a liability determination can be made by the Fayette County MH/MR Office.

What to expect?

After a family has decided to accept family based services, the treatment team initially works with the family focusing on gathering specific information. The team works closely with the family to develop a comprehensive treatment plan, establish goals, a crisis plan and identify safety issues. A family agreement that explains the length of service, confidentiality, treatment team's and family's treatment responsibilities and discharge criteria is developed.

This is a voluntary program and the family can choose at any time to discontinue the services. The program discharge is based on the family accomplishing the identified treatment goals and recommendations.

During the course of treatment and planning for discharge, the team will assist the family in contacting other community agencies for additional supports and services.
